What can you do at different places?

The Blandford School	In Years 10 and 11 – GCSE's and vocational courses In Years 12 and 13 – Level 2 or Level 3 programmes (A level and Vocational)
Other Schools	A similar range of courses to The Blandford School. It may be the case there are different subjects to choose from.
UTC's	University Technical Colleges offer a mixture of academic and technical learning.
Colleges	Colleges such as Weymouth, Bournemouth and Poole and Kingston Maurward offer a range of courses, they will offer a greater range of vocational options.
Apprenticeships	Apprenticeships give you the opportunity to learn and earn. You will work for an employer who will also help you gain formal qualifications, perhaps by sending you to college each week. Apprenticeship come at different levels, so make sure you pick one that is right for you.
University	Following Sixth Form you may choose to go to University. This will enable you to get a degree qualification. In the Sixth Form we will support you when making this decision.
Degree Apprenticeships	Like a lower level apprenticeship you will work for an employer who will also send you to University (probably 1 day per week). You will be paid for the work you do and the employer will pay for your University course.
Employment	Some students may choose to go directly for employment when they leave formal education. Remember to check what career progression there may be and if there is any formal training.....
